As we wrap up another busy week in **Year 3**, we wanted to share some of the great things your children have been working on. In Literacy, we've been continuing having lots of fun writing formal letters. The children have been composing letters to Goldilock's parents, Mr and Mrs Locks, complaining about her terrible behaviour in the 'Three Little Bears' fairy tale. We have been practising using super fronted adverbials and formal language to ensure Goldilock's is duly punished and learns the error of her ways! In Maths, we have been further developing our column addition skills that we visited earlier in the year. The children are confidently exchanging numbers across the tens and hundreds barriers, and we've also been working on reasoning word problems to help them apply what they've learnt in practical situations. In Science this week, we have continued our investigation into 'All Living Things'. The children have been learning about different types of joints in our bodies and how our muscles help our skeletons move. It's been wonderful to see their interest and enthusiasm! Furthermore, the children and staff have thoroughly enjoyed our transition visits to both Manby and Oatlands Infant Schools. The children loved meeting the Year 2s, playing games, and sharing all the fun activities we do here at Cleves. These visits are a fantastic way for them to build confidence as they prepare for the next stage of their education as well as helping the Year 2s feel prepared for Cleves too! All in all another jam packed fun week in year 3 was had by all! Year 4 have had another

great week - despite it being very hot! We've been busy organising events for Sports Day and are very excited for the activities next Thursday afternoon. We were thrilled to hear about the school's summer art exhibition starting and are so proud of ourselves for the work we have on display there - including our postcards and some other special individual pieces. We topped off the week with a Good Work assembly - as if there wasn't enough excitement already!

Year 5 have had another exciting week, full of creativity and hands on learning across the curriculum! In Literacy, the children have published their Coastal Erosion explanation texts. These pieces clearly show their understanding of the processes that shape our coastlines, with well structured paragraphs and excellent use of technical vocabulary. We've now launched our new unit on Pompeii and the children have begun writing dramatic scene settings of the volcanic eruption, using rich description and powerful imagery to bring their ideas to life. In Maths, the children have been learning to read and interpret timetables. This real-world skill has challenged them to apply their problem solving abilities in practical contexts. Don't be surprised if they take the lead next time you're navigating a train station or planning a family day out! In Geography, we've continued our theme of travel by exploring grid references. The children have been learning how to use four and six figure references to locate places on a map accurately. They've enjoyed applying these skills in activities that link directly to navigation and spatial awareness. In Science, we've been researching famous naturalists such as Jane Goodall, Dian Fossey and Birute Galdikas. The children have been fascinated by their groundbreaking work with primates and their efforts to protect endangered species. It's sparked some great conversations about conservation and our role in protecting the planet. Year 6 has had the most wonderful week! A big group of children went to PGL in Liddington. We had the most amazing time doing things we could only dream of. We faced our fears rock climbing, we had our hearts racing on the big swing and even laughed when Miss Christian and Mrs Grant fell in the lake canoeing! Our non-trippers also had a fantastic week creating crayon art with inspirational words, baking delicious biscuits, making stop-motion

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movies and had the time of their lives jumping around at Jump In! We all deserve a very restful and relaxing weekend! See you on Monday!

Year 4, 5 & 6 Girls' Biathlon - 1st July 2025

Notre Dame is hosting a biathlon on Tuesday 1st July for girls in Years 4, 5 and 6. This will take place after school from 3.45pm until 5.00pm

Year 4 girls will swim 50m and then run 600m whilst year 5/6 girls will swim 100m and then run 600m. The girls will come out of the pool after their swim, walk to the transition area where they will

ABSENCE PENALTIES

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council

considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
