Wow, another week in **Year 3** that has been packed with fun activities and great learning experiences. Firstly, our Sports Day was a resounding success, even with the warm weather! The children showed amazing teamwork and sportsmanship, taking part in various activities and earning house points for Arundel, Windsor, York, and Warwick. A big thank you to everyone involved, especially those who helped to ensure the day ran smoothly. In our Literacy lessons, we have continued to explore non-chronological reports. This week, the children had the opportunity to unleash their creativity by designing their own hybrid rainforest animals. The imaginative combinations were a joy to see, with unique creations such as the

'jagufly'—a cross between a jaguar and a butterfly—and the 'slake,' which combines the characteristics of a sloth and a snake. In Maths, we focused on missing digit calculations. The missing digit questions were challenging and made our brains really tick as we had to work out what digits were missing and why in a logical way. The teachers were really impressed with the children's problem-solving skills and determination to understand the concept. During our topic lessons, we engaged in lively class debates regarding deforestation in the Amazon Rainforest. The children shared their opinions and ideas before creating informative posters on this important issue. Yet again, another busy and fun week was had by all! Year 4 had an epic Sports Day this week and all the teachers were incredibly proud and amazed by all the sporting talent on show. We're kicking off our new DT unit all about baking Saxon bread. We'll be tasting some samples next week and we cannot wait! Of course, we know to only eat a certain amount as we have been learning in Science all about balanced diets.

Year 5 has had a fun-filled and action packed week! In Maths, we've kicked off a new unit all about 2D and 3D shapes. The children have been identifying and comparing shapes, exploring properties such as angles, faces, edges and vertices. They're developing strong spatial reasoning skills and enjoying hands-on activities that bring geometry to life. In Literacy, we've been learning to use SNOT in our writing, but not the messy kind! SNOT stands for Show, Not Tell - a technique to help children describe characters' thoughts, feelings and actions without simply stating them. They've put this skill to great use in the first drafts of their narratives about escaping Mount Vesuvius. Their writing is full of suspense, vivid imagery and historical detail, capturing the drama of ancient Pompeii's eruption. Over in Science, our potato plants have been the centre of attention! The Year 5 classes are competing to see whose potatoes grow best and so far 5M is in the lead! This fun challenge has linked with our current topic on the life cycle of plants, where the children have been learning how plants grow, reproduce and adapt to survive. Finally, a huge well done to all the children for their fantastic participation in Sports Day! They showed determination, teamwork and great sportsmanship throughout the day. It was

wonderful to see everyone cheering each other on and giving their best. Another very busy week for **Year 6!** We have had a wonderful time rehearsing for our production and have been filling the school with our beautiful singing. We have even started learning some choreography! We also had a fantastic time representing our houses on Sports Day. We all worked together and showed support to our friends, cheering them on and having lots of fun! We have been writing an informal letter to the Year 5s, telling them all our best tips and tricks as experienced Year 6-ers! We are definitely all ready for a relaxing weekend in the sunshine!

ABSENCE PENALTIES

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- 1. If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 2. If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- 3. If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.
