Year 3! The children have come in with bright smiles, ready to learn, and we've already had a week full of excitement, learning, and creativity. Maths - Investigating Mass - This week in Maths, we've been exploring mass. The children have been busy comparing the weight of different objects and learning how to read scales in grams and kilograms. Literacy – Letters, Letters Everywhere! In Literacy, we've dived into the wonderful world of informal and formal letters. We've explored a variety of engaging texts, including The Jolly Postman, Meerkat Mail, and The Day the Crayons Quit. These books have inspired brilliant discussions and the children are really enjoying taking on the voices of different characters in some hot seating activities. Science - Brilliant Bodies - We continue our Science topic about All Living Things, and we've started with a focus on bones. The children have loved learning about the skeleton – especially naming the different bones and understanding how they help us move and stay upright. Games - Interhouse Fun! - This week we had our Interhouse Games session – what a treat! The children showed amazing teamwork, enthusiasm, and sportsmanship. It was brilliant fun, and a great way to kick off the term with some healthy competition and lots of smiles. It's been such a lovely week getting back into the swing of things. The children have shown great attitudes and a real eagerness to learn. We're very proud of them already and excited for the term ahead! We've had

a fantastic start back to the term in **Year 4**. We have finished our Viking attack literacy unit, producing fantastic outcomes. Our Maths unit on money has come to an end and we move onto learning about angles and shape over the next few weeks. We have also enjoyed continuing to read Kensuke's Kingdom in whole class reading as well as beginning to learn about 3D printing and health and nutrition in Computing and Science. We look forward to what the rest of the term brings!

Welcome to the final half term of Year 5! It's hard to believe we're already in our final stretch of the year and Year 5 have returned full of energy and enthusiasm after a fantastic Isle of Wight trip to end Summer 1. We've hit the ground running across the curriculum. In Literacy, pupils have begun writing an explanation text all about coastal erosion, using their recent visit to The Needles as inspiration. The real-world experience of seeing the dramatic cliffs and sea formations has brought the topic to life! In Maths, we've moved on to exploring volume. The children have been learning to calculate the volume of 3D shapes and are developing a strong understanding of how volume is measured and compared. It's been great to see them apply their reasoning skills in new ways. In Art, we've started an exciting new unit on Georgia O'Keeffe. The students are studying her bold and colourful work, particularly her use of perspective and scale, with the outcome of creating their own O'Keeffe - inspired pieces. The children have been researching the causes behind species decline in Science this week and are beginning to explore how we can take action to help protect wildlife around the world. It's sparked some thoughtful and passionate discussions already! Year 6 have had a very busy first week back and have managed to squeeze in lots of learning in only four days! We have written some excellent pizza recipes where we drew from our own experience making them last term. It has definitely made us all want to bake and (more importantly) eat them all over again! We have also started our World War II enquiry project where we have all begun researching a particular area we are interested in. We have even written a letter to home as an evacuee where we used appropriate slang and showed our informal writing skills. After such a busy week back, we are all looking forward to a relaxing weekend in the

sunshine now that we have officially started our last term at Cleves!
