## THIS WEEK

Welcome back! The children have settled well into their new classes, showing an excellent attitude to their learning. It is also lovely to see them excitedly catching up with their old friends and building relationships with new faces in their classes. We would particularly like to congratulate our new pupils, especially in Year 3, who have made a brilliant start on their Cleves journey.

This term we are focussing on our school value of respect. We have thought about how we can show respect at school and what a school might look like without respect. We have discussed showing respect through our actions, such as speaking politely, listening to others, being honest and

thinking of other people's feelings. You may wish to discuss the importance of this value in your own lives to support your child's understanding and to reiterate a joint message.

What a great start our new **Year 3** pupils have made to life at Cleves! Children are settling well and we are very impressed with how they are quickly adapting to our classroom routines. Poetry has been high on the agenda in our literacy lessons this week. Children have explored a wide range of different types and some were even brave enough to perform to their class. We hope to use what we have learnt to help us write our own pieces of poetry next week. Our maths has begun by exploring place value using a range of different concrete resources. To start our 'United Kingdom' topic we have explored maps of our local area from different periods in history as well as a most recent version. We were shocked to see how much the area around Cleves has changed! We have practised logging on to the Cleves Hub using our new details, so are all ready to start our first homework! **Year 4** have had a very successful and busy first whole week back. The children have enjoyed getting stuck into their learning and have really enjoyed starting our new topic of 'Rivers'. We have been focusing on the different features of a river as this is what we will be looking at on our upcoming river trip! In Literacy, we have been focusing on describing a setting and the children have written some wonderful pieces. In Maths, we are continuing to work on place value and the children particularly enjoyed taking a lesson in the Dance Studio where we explored magnitude of number. The Year 4 team are incredibly proud of all the children and the positive start they have had to Year 4.

The **Year 5** children have made an excellent start to the year and are enjoying our first unit of literacy. Our aim is to write a contrasting setting

description of a megacity and the countryside. For maths, we have started by reviewing place value and numbers up to a million. For the Tudors topic, we're learning about the different monarchs, timelines and important events such as the Magna Carta and the Bubonic Plague. For our unit on portraiture, we have started with recapping on how to draw a face in proportion alongside learning more about famous Tudor artists. In science, we have looked at properties of materials and comparing and grouping them. Earlier in the week, the whole year group were out on the field together getting active in our pace judgement lesson. After some fun warm-up activities and stretching, they completed a range of running tasks which culminated in a race against the clock to reach a target of shuttle runs. Thank you to those who were able to attend the 'meet the teacher' and information evenings this week. If you were not able to make it, all the information will be shared on our website. **Year 6** have had a fantastic start to the term, launching straight into our new topic about the Victorians. We have completed a timeline of the monarchs of the Stuarts and Hanover eras, thus bridging the gap between our knowledge of the Tudors (Year 5) and Victorians. We have also enjoyed learning about key events during these periods including the Gunpowder Plot and the Great Fire of London! In maths, we are busy revising place value and securing our knowledge through developing our reasoning and problem solving. We have also started our new literacy unit based on the book 'Street Child' by Bertie Doherty about a Victorian boy called Jim Jarvis. We used the text to help create impressive vocabulary banks and phrases for describing the workhouse and looked at emotive language, including show not tell to describe how our main character would have felt. We will be using these next week to write our first hot task! In addition to all this, each class is busy reading and voting for their best book in our 'World Cup of Books' challenge - we will announce the winning book from each class next week. We have started our new science 'All living things' unit, looking at how to classify different common characteristics in the three main categories of animals, plants and microorganisms. In art, the children have been introduced to the works of William Morris and we are enjoying our new badminton unit in PE. The children have already

surpassed our expectations with their learning behaviours and have shown they are all ready for the exciting challenges of Year 6. We wish you all a well deserved restful (and hopefully warmer) weekend! Year 6 team.

The morning drop off has certainly become less frantic and calmer as the week has gone on. Thank you for your support with this. Please can we ask that all children enter the school on their own from Monday 16th September. It has been great to see so many Year 3s doing this already. ## UNIFORM AND EARRINGS

Just a reminder that earrings are not part of our school uniform. If your child has had their ears pierced over the summer holiday and can't yet take them out, they should be covered with tape before they come to school. Once safe to be removed, earrings should not be worn.

## MEDICATION

Thank you to all parents who have brought in their child's school medication. If you still need to bring this in, please drop it into reception.

Please note that all medication must be in the original box as dispensed by the pharmacist.

You will also need to complete the necessary forms.

## SNACKS

Please remember we have asked that neither snacks or packed lunches should not contain nuts or sesame, which includes hummus. I understand it is a great healthy snack but we have children severely allergic to sesame.

If your child would like a snack at breaktime it must only be fruit or vegetables.

## APPOINTMENTS

All medical and dental appointments should be notified in advance to the Welfare Officer via [absence@cleves.co.uk](mailto:absence@cleves.co.uk) and Class Teacher. Where possible (emergencies being the exception) such appointments should be kept to a minimum as many doctors and dentists offer surgeries outside of school times. However, if appointments have to be made during school hours, it is expected that the pupil will return promptly after the appointment. If for some reason this is not possible, parents should contact the Welfare Officer to discuss before making the decision not to return to school.
