Year 3

It has been a great week focussing on our anti bullying week starting with our wonderful odd sock day. Year 3 have been learning about bullying this week and what it means. They also learned what to do if they were being bullied or a friend was being bullied, so hopefully they all are well equipped to deal with a situation if it ever arose. Also this week we have continued working on our Fantastic Mr Fox playscripts. In Maths we have started a unit on multiplication and division with a focus on arrays, and multiples of 2 and 4 and grouping. This half term in Science we will be investigating rocks. We started by looking at the different types of rocks and then making observation sketches of different rocks. After a wonderful, creative art unit last half term we will now be moving on to our DT unit of sewing stockings. We began this first week by experimenting with different types of stitches. The children will bring home their amazing creations just in time to use at Christmas.

Year 4

We've had another busy and exciting week in Year 4, filled with creativity, learning, and opportunities to reflect and work together. We kicked off Anti-Bullying Week by celebrating Odd Socks Day, a fun reminder that our differences make us unique and special. The children enjoyed showing off their colourful, mismatched socks and took part in discussions and activities about kindness, respect, and standing up for others. Our Outdoor Learning and science activities continued this week. The children explored nature, investigated scientific concepts in hands-on ways, and developed their teamwork and problem-solving skills. Muddy boots and big smiles all round! In Literacy, we completed our drafts of non-chronological reports on the River Thames. The children have worked hard to include technical vocabulary, subheadings, and fascinating facts. We'll be polishing and finishing them on Monday, ready to proudly share the final versions.

Year 4 (cont'd)

We've started exploring patterns in times tables, and Year 4 have been excited to become number detectives. Did you know? If you add up all the digits in a number and the sum is a multiple of 3, then that number is also a multiple of 3! The children loved testing this out with different numbers and spotting the patterns for themselves.

Year 6 Boys' District Football Tournament

Yesterday our Year 6 boys' football team enjoyed a brilliant day of football at the ERPSSA 7-a-side tournament, where we were able to enter two teams - Cleves A and Cleves B - both proudly wearing their brand-new, PTA-sponsored kits.

Both teams made an outstanding start, winning every single one of their group matches. Cleves A were in excellent form throughout, with their standout moment coming in a 1–0 victory over St Cuthberts, last year's champions. Cleves B were equally impressive, playing confident attacking football and producing a superb 4–0 win over Cardinal Newman as their highlight.

The strong performances continued into the knockout stages: Cleves A produced a dominant win against Cardinal Newman. whilst Cleves B battled hard and secured a narrow but deserved victory over St Charles.

Drama then followed in the semi-finals:
Cleves A maintained their composure and quality, defeating Holy Family 2–0 in another assured performance against strong opponents. Meanwhile Cleves B were desperately unlucky - after a tightly contested match against Ashley, they were beaten only in sudden-death penalties.

The final saw Cleves A face Ashley in what proved to be a confident and controlled display. The team rounded off their superb day with a 2–0 win, securing the tournament title in style.

It was almost a Cleves-versus-Cleves final, and both teams represented the school brilliantly from start to finish. Cleves A finished the competition having won every game and not conceding a single goal - a remarkable achievement, whilst Cleves B also played brilliantly throughout the day and were incredibly close to reaching the final themselves.

We now proceed to the Surrey Finals in January. Well done to everyone involved!

Absence Penalties

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

Absence Penalties (cont'd)

 If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Leave of Absence

Please be aware that we have introduced a new system for the recording of absence using a newly created page on our school website. This will allow us to centralise the messages we receive and create a smoother process for our staff.

The <u>Absence Reporting Tab</u> allows you to record:

- 1. Sickness (on the day)
- 2. Requests for absence from school known in advance

Please note that the email address absence@cleves.co.uk is no longer in use. We kindly also ask that you do not email info@cleves.co.uk or office@cleves.co.uk with any absence information as these inboxes are not monitored consistently throughout the day. This will help ensure that your message is received promptly by our admin team.
