Year 3

Year 3 had a fantastic time during their Ancient Egypt immersion days this week, where they learned all about how Ancient Egypt developed, its rulers, gods, mummification, and even Cleopatra! The children looked absolutely fabulous in their costumes and are showing great curiosity and enthusiasm as they continue to explore this fascinating period.

In Literacy, we have finished our diary writing unit, with the children creating their own diaries from the perspective of Rhodopis, one of the main characters in The Egyptian Cinderella. They thought carefully about her thoughts, feelings, and experiences, producing some really thoughtful and imaginative work.

In Maths, we have continued learning about multiplication and methods to help us multiply two-digit numbers by one-digit numbers. We have also started to use our multiplication facts to help us with division, exploring fact families to see how multiplication and division are connected.

We are looking forward to another exciting week of learning and fun next week!

Year 4

This week, Year 4 have worked hard across the curriculum. In Maths, we've started dividing large numbers using part whole models. There's a lot of steps but we're persevering! In Literacy, we have just finished composing our Explanation Texts about The Digestive System and the wonderful journey food takes through the human body - from mouth to rectum! We've explored Ancient Greek cities in History and looked further at Jewish celebrations. Now, we're on the edge of our seats wondering what will happen next week in The Iron Man ...

Year 5

It's been a busy week in Year 5 with both Tudor and Space related activities going on!

It was the turn of the other three classes to make their pottage (soups) that they planned before half term. Thank you to all adult helpers across the six classes - it does make a huge difference. In Literacy, children completed their rocket poem and were asked to perform it in front of a small group.

Within Science, we explored why we have day and night on Earth. We also discussed how long days are on different planets in our solar system. Did you know.. some days on other planets are longer than their year!

We finished the week off with our Space day, which was a huge success. A particular highlight was seeing the Solar System come to life in front of our eyes inside the Wonderome. We also completed a range of other activities.

Year 6

In Year 6 this week we have been looking at the importance of internet safety in Computing and as a result we have become 'internet legends'.

We have been discovering food miles in our DT cooking unit, exploring how and why we import and export food. We will be applying this learning to our cooking sessions that are coming up soon.

We have also continued looking at the environment in Geography, with focus on the positives and negatives of plastic use, but mainly on the damaging impacts plastic pollution has on the environment.





Absence Penalties

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

Absence Penalties

(cont'd)

- If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Leave of Absence

Please be aware that we have introduced a new system for the recording of absence using a newly created page on our school website. This will allow us to centralise the messages we receive and create a smoother process for our staff.

The Absence Reporting Tab allows you to record:

1. Sickness (on the day)
2. Requests for absence from school - known in advance

Please note that the email address absence@cleves.co.uk is no longer in use. We kindly also ask that you do not email info@cleves.co.uk or office@cleves.co.uk with any absence information as these inboxes are not monitored consistently throughout the day. This will help ensure that your message is received promptly by our admin team.
