THIS WEEK

This week it has been anti bullying week at Cleves which started with odd socks day on Monday. Mrs Hamilton, our PSHE lead, led a whole school assembly on Monday which was based on this year's theme of 'reaching out' to stop bullying. In class the children have spent their PSHE lessons learning that everyone has a role in stopping bullying from taking place, particularly the bystander - someone who is not directly affected by bullying but sees it happening.

On Tuesday evening, it was lovely to see so many children coming back to showcase the school at our Year 2 Prospective Parents evening. They all did a fantastic job and so many of the visiting parents

were complimentary about the school but particularly our pupils

It's been another exciting week in **Year 3** and we have started our new topic on playscripts, returning to Roald Dahl's 'Fantastic Mr Fox' as our stimulus. As we already know the story, we have been focusing on the key features of playscripts such as stage directions and the layout of a playscript. Pupils have collaborated in groups to have a go at acting out a scene and practising using different intonation and volume as well as uplevelling a scene with missing features. Next week, we will be jointly planning a scene, writing the dialogue and practising our scene before filming it in front of a green screen. In maths, we have been focusing on the 4 times table and learning the key multiplication and division facts as well as applying our knowledge to solve problems. Next week, we will be moving on to the 8 times table. In RE, we have been learning about key Hindu beliefs, where Hindus go to worship and key traditions and customs. One of the highlights of the last fortnight has also been our visits to the Natural History Museum where we have had the opportunity to explore lots of the different exhibits as well as attend an Ocean life and habitat show linked to our science topic on 'All living things'. The children have thoroughly enjoyed the visits and we'd like to say a huge thank you to all of the parent helpers who accompanied us on the trips and to all of the school staff who helped organise them as we couldn't have gone without your help! **Year 4** has had another fantastic week! We have all finished our amazing persuasive letters to the 'Wastealot Family', persuading them to live a more environmentally friendly lifestyle and some tips to be more sustainable. We have been working very hard in Maths exploring multiplication and division. We have been looking at dividing and multiplying by 10 and 100, and started to explore our common times tables in more detail. In P.E we are continuing to develop our badminton skills. We focussed on perfecting our serves this week! We are developing our understanding of Hinduism in R.E and this week we explored how Hindus celebrate Diwali. In DT we are starting to construct our own canvas bags and sew up the hems. We have used all of our fantastic knowledge gained from studying teeth in Science to explore how we can keep our teeth clean and

healthy. We have also studied how important our teeth are, and that we must look after them! As this week was Anti-Bullying Week, we have all been celebrating what makes us unique as we wore odd socks, actively took part in our PSHE lessons and learnt all about this year's theme, 'Reach Out'. It has empowered us to all come together in a positive way to stop bullying! Well done everyone for working so hard this week and have a great weekend!

This week in **Year 5** we have continued to work on our Basketball skills with a focus on dribbling and ball control. We had great fun at the end of the lesson game where we played King and Queen of the hill which was very entertaining! In Maths, we have started looking at area and perimeter with a focus on calculating perimeter of compound shapes. In whole class guided reading, we have continued reading about the adventures of Jason and Jam in *The Runner* by Keith Gray. We have continued learning about exploration in Tudor times through a lesson about Sir Francis Drake and The Golden Hind - I think we're all feeling inspired and ready to go on a voyage of our own now! We also have continued the theme of Tudors into our literacy topic and have now written our hot task following a letter we were given that warned us about a assassination plot against King Henry VIII! We have written up the moment that we confront the assassin and have paused the week on a cliffhanger, watch this space to find out how our stories end. Well done **Year 6** for another busy week. In Science, children have been continuing our unit on Evolution and Inheritance by looking at characteristics and what happens when breeding dogs. In Literacy, we have continued our creative description based on the short film called 'Origins'. In Maths, Year 6 have continued revisiting fractions, learning how to add and subtract fractions including mixed numbers. This week, in History we have learnt about the Factory Act and the appalling working conditions during the Victorian Era and what the 5 Acts brought in during the 1860s. In Computing, pupils completed their Spark Video on Marcus Rashford. Further classes have created their clay tile from their design inspired by William Morris. Well done to 6B for their excellent class assembly this afternoon!
