

THIS WEEK

This week has been another busy week with lots of fabulous learning happening. Year 6 had a magical

trip to the theatre, where they represented the school well.

Just a forward look to next week as we are celebrating World Book Day on Friday 8th March. Please remember that you do not need to purchase a costume. Hand made costumes are often the best! We look forward to seeing all the children dressed as book characters next week!

It's been another busy week in Year 3 and we are thoroughly enjoying our literary unit on non-chronological reports focused on dragons. Pupils have been creating their own dragons using their imagination and have been drawing and labelling pictures of them as well as writing about their dragons' appearance, habitat, diet and sharing some interesting facts. This week, pupils have focused on planning, writing and uplevelling their work ahead of producing their best version next week. In maths, we have been focusing on division and dividing 2 digit numbers by 1 digit numbers using partitioning, concrete resources and our knowledge of multiplication facts to help us. We have also been exploring scaling problems using our knowledge of multiplication and division and investigating problems trying to find all of the different possibilities. In science, we have started our unit on light and have been learning about what light is and identifying different sources of light and different things that reflect light, rather than producing it. In RE, we have been learning about the story of Moses and the Burning Bush and considering what this Bible story might tell Christians about God. In art, we have been sketching our cartouches ahead of making them out of clay in the next couple of weeks. This week Year 4 have continued our poetry lesson, researching different types of poems and then starting to create our own. The children have demonstrated creative and interesting ideas. Whole class reading this week was a study of an extract from Aquila by Andrew Norriss. In maths we continue our focus on Time and looking at the 24 hour clock and the difference between analogue and digital clocks. During science we focussed on the parts of the ear and also how we hear sound.

In topic lessons we made some wonderful Ancient Greek masks out of clay.

Year 5 have been busy continuing looking at decimal numbers in maths this week. Excitingly, we have started a new Literacy unit writing our very own science fiction narrative. This is being inspired by the book, "The Lost Thing" by Shaun Tan. We have been describing an alien setting and imagining how this strange world may look. In Science, we have been learning more about gravity and how it affects the moon's orbit around the Earth, and our topic lessons have started to look at space exploration and where we could travel to next! We have had a great hands on week in Year 6! We have been to the theatre in London to see the amazing Lion King show and we will be using this fantastic experience over the next few weeks in Literacy to write a theatre review. We will also use the Lion King show and the brilliant choreography to inspire and guide our new dance unit in PE. Finally, in Science we have started our new unit on Light, exploring how light reflects.
