Year 3

The Year 3 children are busy working hard this autumn term, with the bonus excitement of seeing some snowfall too!

In Computing, the children had great fun filming their Fantastic Mr Fox scripts using the green-screen and watching them back. We definitely have some budding actors and actresses and some keen directors. In Maths we are continuing our unit on multiplication and division with a focus on the 3 and 4 times tables and using different strategies to multiply and divide by these numbers. We have started a new unit in Literacy, we will be writing letters as Mary Anning on her latest discovery. Our new Literacy unit links well with our Science unit on Rocks and Soils. This week in Science we completed an investigation into the different properties of a range of rocks. We designed our Christmas stockings in DT this week. Thank you to all the parents who have supported us with cutting out the felt and those who have offered to support in class with the sewing.

Speaking of Christmas, poems and songs for our Christmas performance should now be on the Google Classroom for the children to practice at home. We cannot wait to perform for you all on the 9th December.

Year 4

What a busy, chilly, and exciting week we've had in Year 4! Despite the cold and icy weather, the children have shown fantastic enthusiasm in all areas of their learning. The frosty mornings and icy playground made for lots of excitement! Thank you for ensuring the children have come to school wrapped up warm - it's made breaktimes much more enjoyable.

The Year 4's have been channelling their inner environmental activists. We explored the issue of pollution in the River Thames and discussed ways we can help keep our local environment clean. The children are getting ready to write persuasive letters, urging others to take action and care for this important river. In Science, we looked closely at the different types of teeth humans have and their roles. To put their learning into action, the children bit into apples to observe how their incisors, canines, and molars each help us eat. This hands-on investigation led to some fantastic discussions and very enthusiastic chomping!

Year 4 (cont'd)

Our work in Computing took a creative turn as we continued learning how to use GarageBand. The children practised layering sounds, adjusting tempo, and experimenting with loops as they began planning to create their own original pieces of music. We can already hear some budding digital composers in the making! We were delighted to welcome children's author Steve Williams to Year 4 this week. The children loved hearing about his writing process and asked thoughtful questions. His visit left them inspired, and many were keen to pick up a notebook (or tablet!) and start writing stories of their own.



Thank you so very much to everyone who sponsored them... So far they have raised an incredible £2,188!!


Currently, we have managed to buy 75 Christmas gifts for children, who would not normally receive one... we are so proud!

Absence Penalties

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

Absence Penalties (cont'd)

 If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Leave of Absence

Please be aware that we have introduced a new system for the recording of absence using a newly created page on our school website. This will allow us to centralise the messages we receive and create a smoother process for our staff.

The <u>Absence Reporting Tab</u> allows you to record:

- 1. Sickness (on the day)
- 2. Requests for absence from school known in advance

Please note that the email address absence@cleves.co.uk is no longer in use. We kindly also ask that you do not email info@cleves.co.uk or office@cleves.co.uk with any absence information as these inboxes are not monitored consistently throughout the day. This will help ensure that your message is received promptly by our admin team.
