THIS WEEK

I hope you all had a good Easter break. It was lovely to welcome back the children this week and they have spent the last three days being immersed into their new curriculum topic. It has also been really heartwarming to hear about the many fundraising activities and the huge efforts that our children have gone to to support the people of Ukraine. Donations made online currently stand at an incredible £8426.06 and we have yet to count the money handed to us in person. It's been a really busy three days on our return and **Year 3** have definitely hit the ground running! The other half of the year group had their rescheduled Ancient Egyptian day and had lots of fun dressing up and participating in a range of activities and

games to complete our fantastic spring term topic from a quiz, learning how to measure Ancient Egyptian style and witnessing the mummification of a pharaoh! We also started our new literacy topic focused on the Legend of St George and the dragon and discussed the difference between a myth and a legend. We also talked about who St George was and shared the story before acting it out in groups and identifying the main events. In maths, we have been focusing on identifying equivalent fractions using bar models and number lines. Next week, we will be comparing fractions. In games, we have started our summer sports rotation and begun to practise skills linked to cricket, athletics and tennis. In PE, we are learning the skills and rules linked to basketball. We have also started our new topic on rainforests and, in geography, have been learning about latitude; what it is and what it's measured in.

Year 4 has had a fantastic first week back! They have been busy solving and writing their own riddles in Literacy, exploring form and comparing them with a variety of kenning poems. We have started our new History unit, Invaders and Settlers, in preparation for Hooke Court and the fun activities planned for everyone who is staying at school next week! In Games we have started practising our skills of a variety of different sports including, rounders, tennis and cricket. We are also finishing our Science topic, Sound, by making our own ear defenders and conducting an experiment to see if distance affects the pitch or volume of musical instruments. We have started to develop our prior knowledge of fractions in Maths, as we have been finding fractions of amounts. Last term we were studying Hundertwasser's work in Art and this week we have brought all our learning together and created a bright and colourful piece of work, filled with texture, showing off our new skills.

It has been lovely to see everyone back in school and **Year 5** has as ever started the term as we mean to go on, with a full schedule. We watched and discussed the story of Treasure Island with the ultimate aim of children designing their own pirate and writing a descriptive paragraph about their

character. In Maths we have started the term by working with Decimals in many different ways. Land formations is the main Geographical theme of the term, we kicked off by looking at the structure of the earth and associated definitions. In Science we have the theme of all Living Things. We have commenced this section by looking at how plants replicated themselves and have started a long experiment growing potatoes. The competition is well and truly on to see who can be the most successful class. Year 6 have had a wonderful start to the summer term. We have started our new topic on World War II, which the children are already engrossed in. Within our Literacy lessons we are reading Friend or Foe by Michael Morpurgo and we will be writing a third person narrative over the next couple of weeks. During maths lessons we have been studying graphs and charts and interpreting the data they contain. In Games this week the children all competed in an exciting Inter House competition and showed all the skills they have been learning within lessons. All the year 6 staff and students are excited for the term ahead.

INTERNET SAFETY

This week's free online safety article is all about spotting ads on social media

Social media has not only redrawn the landscape in terms of advertising exposure: it's ripped up the rulebook on buyer behaviour. Potential customers are now shown adverts based on their interests. Digital devices let us instantly convert that impulse to buy into an actual purchase. We can be persuaded that we want a product without even realising we've been advertised to.

This can be especially harmful for younger people. A recent survey, for example, found that 86% of teens regularly see adverts for junk food on social media; 62% reported seeing gambling ads (although rules on promoting this around under-18s have since been tightened). Our guide has some top ideas for helping youngsters to spot ads like a pro!
