## THIS WEEK

Welcome to February! Another exciting week with lots going on. Just a reminder that lessons start promptly at 8:50 so please ensure your child is in school with plenty of time to get organised before the school day. It really does make a difference to how the day goes. As you can see from reading below, there have been lots of fabulous learning this week. Have a good weekend!

It's been another jam packed week in **Year 3** and we have started our new literacy unit on Alternative Tales. We began with a discussion about traditional tales and looked at the stories of Jack and the Beanstalk and Little Red Riding Hood. We then discussed what was meant by an alternative tale and the idea of a twist or a different ending. Pupils had lots of fun thinking about and acting out some different endings to Little Red Riding Hood. We have also shared the story of 'Jim and the

Beanstalk' and focused on the personalities of the two main characters. Pupils also enjoyed comparing the traditional tale of 'The Princess and the Pea' with an alternative version. In maths, we have continued our work on length and have been adding and subtracting lengths as well as finding the perimeter of different shapes and objects, both through measuring them and using measurements given. In science, we have been carrying out an investigation to explore the impact of light, air, water and nutrients on plant growth and making observations to help us draw conclusions. One of the highlights of the week has to be our falafel making as part of our DT unit and pupils really enjoyed tasting some shop-bought falafel and comparing it to their own. Pupils had lots of fun following the recipe and drawing on their knowledge of instructions from our previous literacy unit. They collaborated really well in their groups and produced some delicious food! We'd like to say a huge thank you to the parent volunteers who came into help - we really do appreciate it!! This week in **Year 4** we have started our new literacy unit on The Iron Man. For the last four weeks we have been enjoying the story of The Iron Man during whole class reading sessions and now we are going to use the text to inspire diary writing. In maths we have also started a new unit on fractions. We started by reviewing what the children learned in year 3 and moving onto comparing and ordering fractions and studying tenths and hundredths. In science we are concluding our interesting Electricity unit with an investigation into what materials could be used to make switches. In topic we are continuing our study of the Ancient Greeks by discovering how our modern day language is inspired by Greek works. In RE we have moved onto understanding how Lent prepares Christians for Easter. So those families who will be enjoying pancakes during half term on Shrove Tuesday can ask their children to explain the meaning behind the Christian event.

**In Year 5** this week we have finished our work on The Firemaker's Daughter and have proudly written up their 'missing' chapter in their Special Writing Book. In Science, the children have learnt about the geocentric and heliocentric models of the solar system and the contributions of Ptolemy, Copernicus and Galileo. In art, our Pop Art unit continues with some digital art on illusions which will also form part of their homework. Our RE unit this term is called 'HINDU (SANATAN) DHARMA: Why should Hindus live a good life?' and in PSHE we have been looking at being part of a community. In preparation for our next literacy unit, we have been learning about the details of the Apollo 11 mission to land humans onto the moon. Year 6 have had a creative, hands on and fun week! We have been looking at pizza instructions in Literacy, analysing the features of a recipe after we cooked our very own yummy pizzas in DT last week. In Science we completed an investigation to create an explosive rocket, looking at how sodium acetate, water and carbon dioxide react together. As more carbon dioxide is produced, there is a build up of pressure and this pressure causes the rocket to launch! And we have been coding Mindstorm robots in Computing.
