Free School Meals Eligibility

Please could we encourage you to check eligibility for free school meals for students. Surrey County Council estimates there are over 2,000 families who would likely be found eligible for free school meals, but aren't currently accessing this entitlement.

Currently, any child found eligible for free school meals enjoys protected status under transitional protection arrangements, meaning they remain eligible until the end of their current phase of education. However, this may change very soon with the media reporting expected ending of these protections.

Breck Foundation Visit – Online Safety Sessions

We are pleased to inform you that on **Wednesday 4th March**, our school will be welcoming a speaker from the **Breck Foundation**, a charity that specialises in educating children and adults about online safety.

The sessions will be delivered as follows:

- **Year 3 and Year 4:** Online Safety
- **Year 5 and Year 6:** Separate sessions covering Online Safety and Grooming (*Breck's Story*)
- **School staff** will also take part in a dedicated after-school session.

In addition, parents and carers are invited to attend an **online talk on Monday 2nd March 6-7pm**, led by the Breck Foundation. This session will help you understand the issues discussed with the children and provide guidance on how to support your child's online safety at home. The session will be attended by parents from several schools.

We believe this is an extremely important topic, and that using experienced professionals with up-to-date knowledge of online practices is essential. However, the cost of providing these sessions is significant, and we would be grateful for any voluntary donations to help offset the expense.



Football Round Up

On Monday afterschool, the Year 5 Boys' A Team were back in action again. This time out, it was a league fixture at home against a strong Burhill team. During the opening 5 minutes, Cleves pressed high up and retained possession well. The boys moved the ball round the pitch with a high tempo and created several chances. Soon after the second half started, Cleves took the lead from a well worked finish over the keepers head. The boys then continued to challenge them for the ball and looked for another goal. Burhill continued to keep a deep defensive line and were hard to break down for a second goal. Holding out, the game finished with a 1-0 win to Cleves. A huge 3 points from the boys and a win to keep them challenging for the title! Well done to all those involved in the fixture!

Wednesday saw both the Year 5/6 girls and the Year 6 boys in Surrey Cup action. The boys faced a tough tie against Banstead Community School, a side who had scored an impressive 14 goals in the previous round. Cleves started the match brightly and dominated much of the

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first half, with goals from Kaan and Oscar giving them a deserved two-goal lead. There were further chances to extend the advantage, but just before half time Banstead pulled one back.

Unfortunately, the second half proved far more challenging, with Banstead scoring four further goals to win the tie 5–2 and progress to the next round. While disappointing, it was a well-earned victory for Banstead and one the Cleves boys should quickly move on from in what is turning out to be a really successful and enjoyable season.

In contrast, the girls enjoyed a much more comfortable victory in the Surrey Cup fixture away against Manor Park. Despite a challenging first half, where the opposition proved tough to break down, the girls moved the ball much quicker in the second half with some one and two touch football and came out 5–0 winners. They now advance to the quarter finals of the Surrey County Cup. Well done to all the girls who took part in what were very cold conditions!

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That same evening, the Year 6 B team were in league action against Grovelands. For many pupils, this was their first opportunity to represent the school, and they rose to the occasion superbly. A determined and attacking performance, combined with excellent teamwork, saw goals in each half secure a deserved 2–0 victory. The scoreline could have been even higher were it not for some heroic defending from Grovelands. Well done to all involved.

Finally, on Thursday afternoon, a group of Year 4 boys took part in the WWHSP indoor football festival, hosted by Cleves. Five teams — Cleves, St James, Cardinal Newman, Ashley and Grovelands — enjoyed an afternoon of fast-paced 5-a-side football. As a festival event, there were no overall winners, but the quality, intensity and enthusiasm on show highlighted just how bright the future of football is at the school.

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The standout moment was a superb 8–0 win against Cardinal Newman. Well done to Rory, Rowan, Brody, Henry, Freddie, Jenson, Rex and Finlay for representing Cleves so well.





Absence Penalties

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

Absence Penalties

(cont'd)

- If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

Leave of Absence

Please be aware that we have introduced a new system for the recording of absence using a newly created page on our school website. This will allow us to centralise the messages we receive and create a smoother process for our staff.

The Absence Reporting Tab allows you to record:

1. Sickness (on the day)
2. Requests for absence from school - known in advance

Please note that the email address absence@cleves.co.uk is no longer in use. We kindly also ask that you do not email info@cleves.co.uk or office@cleves.co.uk with any absence information as these inboxes are not monitored consistently throughout the day. This will help ensure that your message is received promptly by our admin team.
