THIS WEEK

We welcomed May this week. The children continue to work extremely hard and produce fantastic work. Year 4 had an exciting week with their body percussion workshops and the Year 3s continued to monitor the chicks closely.

Please can we ask you to continue reflecting on your child's school uniform as there are still a number of children wearing boots or multicoloured hair accessories. There is a copy of our school guidance below. I hope you all have a lovely weekend. Remember it is Bank Holiday on Monday so we will all be back to school on Tuesday.

It's been another action-packed week in Year 3 and we have been really excited to have the chicks in our classes during the week. This has also given the children the opportunity to closely observe them and also to hold them too! In addition, we have been classifying different living things into groups in science as well as learning about the seven life processes (or Mrs Nerg!) In literacy, pupils have been uplevelling their explanation texts on how a frog changes during its life cycle and publishing their best versions in their special writing books. In maths, we have been focusing on identifying different angles, including acute, right and obtuse angles as well as practising measuring and drawing lines with a ruler. Pupils have also been identifying horizontal and vertical lines and next week we will be focusing on parallel and perpendicular lines and 2D shapes. In RE, we have been continuing our unit on Islam and learning about a mosque and why it's an important place for Muslims. In our topic lessons, we have been identifying the different continents on a world map, learning about where the major rainforests are in the world and some key facts about them. In PE, we have been practising our basketball skills and in Games we have been focusing on different areas of athletics such as running and jumping. Year 4 have had a wonderful week which has included a fabulous 'Beat goes on' workshop. A big thankyou to Mr Kilhams for organising this for us. We have also completed our Riddles and Kennings unit in literacy. The children wrote their own riddles which they recorded and added to seesaw. We had great fun working out what their riddles were about. In maths we have started our new unit on fractions, continuing on from our fractions work earlier in the year. We have focussed on fractions of shapes and amounts. In science, we have continued our unit of Living Things by grouping plants using a classification key and creating our own. The children have really enjoyed our whole class reading unit on Kensuke's Kingdom. Michael Morpurgo is a fantastic author and we encourage the children to discover some of his other incredible books to read. Year 4 have put their learning from last week into practice during our topic by studying the Roman

Legacy. Finally we are having a big push on times tables as we edge closer to the multiplication test in June. Please encourage your children to complete Tackling Tables at least 3 times a week and any other times tables games they enjoy. Time tables are a crucial skill to many elements of maths which is why children need to know their times tables up to 12x12.

Year 5 have had a very busy week and have thoroughly enjoyed all of our learning! During our Literacy unit, we have come to the final few lessons on completing our narrative about our pirates and have even included some dialogue between the despicable, cruel pirate and the polite, kind and young Jim Hawkins. We have moved on with our decimal numbers in Maths and have now started a new unit on Measurements, converting between metres and kilometres. Year 5 have had such fun in DT this week, where we have spent lots of time studying different types of bridges and some of us have even had a go at building our own bridges made from straws. We hope to perfect them next week and see if some can hold more than 1kg! During our Games lessons, we have now finished our current rotation with a final lesson working on our game situations for tennis and cricket and even practising the relay event around our track on the field. Our computing lessons have focussed on Google Forms and we have had great enjoyment in creating new forms and guizzes to send to our peers to answer. We created topic based questions with a variety of types of questions to test each other's knowledge! Year 6 has had another very exciting week! We have started our second chapter of our third person descriptive narrative about two characters who are being evacuated to the countryside in World War II. We have introduced more characters showing the contrast in all the different personalities. We have been looking at different artists in Art, creating a fantastic piece of work inspired by Franz Kline, Jackson Pollock and Kazu Shiraga. We are all thoroughly enjoying abstract expressionism as we can express ourselves differently! Even though we are all busy preparing for SATs coming up we have still managed to squeeze in a fun immersion day! We all came in dressed up as though we were being evacuated and had a great time immersing ourselves in all the activities. Have a great weekend Year 6 and well done for all your hard work!

Year 4, 5 and 6 Girls Biathlon

Notre Dame is hosting a biathlon on Thursday 18th May for girls in Years 4, 5 and 6. Note that Year 5 are on their residential trip on this date so only those not attending the trip can sign up.

This will take place after school from 3.45pm until 5.30pm

Year 4 girls will swim 50m and then run 600m whilst year 5/6 girls will swim 100m and then run 600m. The girls will come out of the pool after their swim, walk to the transition area where they will put on their school PE top and trainers and then complete the run.

It is a timed event as opposed to all the girls swimming/running against each other at the same time. It is a very relaxed and supportive event but the girls do need to be able to swim and run the above distance.

Places are open to 8 girls in each year group, so please can I ask you to complete the following form to express an interest in your child attending. The deadline for completing the form is Monday 6th May where I will then confirm if your child has been selected. Places may need to be drawn out of a hat if demand is high.
