






# Year 3

It has been a busy start to the second half of the Autumn term. Year 3 have settled back in very well. In Literacy we are continuing our focus on *Fantastic Mr Fox*, this unit we are creating play scripts which we will be filming. We started with identifying features of playscripts and then discussed the different types of sentences - statement, command, question and exclamation. We are carrying our Maths unit on Addition and Subtraction. We started this week looking at visual representations for number bonds to 100, followed by estimating answers and learning how to use the inverse operation. In Computing we have taught the children how to send appropriate emails using their gmail accounts. They have enjoyed emailing their teachers with interesting facts about themselves.

# Year 4

We've had another exciting and busy week in Year 4, and the children have been working incredibly hard across all areas of learning! Here's a look at what we've been up to and what's coming up next week.

This week in Literacy, the children have been continuing to explore how to write a non-chronological report. We've focused our writing on the River Thames, learning about important landmarks and leisure activities. The children have enjoyed using fascinating facts and putting them into paragraphs. You might like to ask them to share one of their favourite facts about the Thames at home!

In Maths, we have been developing our understanding of finding the area. The children have been counting squares to find the area of different rectilinear shapes.

Despite the wet weather one half of Year 4 were outside for Outdoor Learning. The children have enjoyed creating imaginative stories inspired by their story sticks, painting stones and using tools to whittle wood into Robin Hood inspired arrows. The other half were enjoying Science day.

# Year 4 (cont'd)

We were very lucky to have some parents come in to show the children some fascinating demonstrations, an external team showed the children a variety of skulls and teeths and our teachers showed the children a live demonstration of the digestive system!

Next week is Anti-Bullying Week, and our theme this year is “The Power for Good.” We’ll be discussing what kindness looks like, how to be a good friend, and the importance of speaking up if we see unkind behaviour. Monday will be Odd Socks Day, so children are encouraged to wear odd socks to celebrate individuality and difference. Thank you, as always, for your continued support.

We’re looking forward to another wonderful week of learning ahead!

# Year 5

Year 5 have jumped straight back into our termly topic with some classes visiting Hampton Court Palace (see photo below) - a fun and interesting trip that really brings the Tudors to life. In Literacy, we have started our new unit where we put ourselves into the shoes of a Tudor spy, trying to save the Queen's jewels from being stolen. Maths lessons have involved practicing our skills by multiplying and dividing by 10, 100 and 1000. We are also continuing to investigate different materials and their properties by separating solids in Science. In Whole Class Reading, we have started our new book - The Runner by Keith Gray.



# Year 6

This week in Year 6 it has been full of exciting learning and creativity! In Literacy we have started our new unit on narrative writing, inspired by a short film about a robot. The children have enjoyed exploring characters, settings and emotions to begin planning their own narrative writing. All six classes had a fantastic time visiting the local Synagogue where they learned more about Jewish traditions and worship. The visit helped deepen our understanding of different faiths and cultures. Back in school some classes have continued their art projects, carefully crafting and decorating their beautiful clay tiles.



# Absence Penalties

Just to remind parents/carers that if they take their children out of school without authority for 5 or more days (which do not have to be consecutive), then the following will apply:

- If you have not incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children in a rolling 3 year period since 19 August 2024, then the penalty notice will be charged at the rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. This will be reduced to £80.00 if paid within 21 days of receipt of the notice. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.
- If you have incurred a penalty notice relating to this child/children since 19 August 2024, the rolling 3 year period will be activated from the date of the first penalty notice and the second penalty notice will be charged at the flat rate of £160.00, per parent/carer per child, if paid within 28 days. There will be no reduction for payment within 21 days. Failure to pay the Penalty Notice will result in Surrey County Council considering legal proceedings against you in the Magistrates Court.

# Absence Penalties

## (cont'd)

- If you have incurred 2 penalty notices relating to this child/children in the rolling 3 year period since the first penalty notice was issued, then you will NOT receive a third penalty notice – Surrey County Council will have no option but to consider a prosecution, per parent/carer per child, in the Magistrates Court under s 444 Education Act 1996.

Surrey County Council is not responsible for authorising pupil absence and therefore cannot withdraw any Penalty Notice requests without the written permission of the Headteacher.

# Leave of Absence

Please be aware that we have introduced a new system for the recording of absence using a newly created page on our school website. This will allow us to centralise the messages we receive and create a smoother process for our staff.

The Absence Reporting Tab allows you to record:

1. Sickness (on the day)
2. Requests for absence from school - known in advance

Please note that the email address [absence@cleves.co.uk](mailto:absence@cleves.co.uk) is no longer in use. We kindly also ask that you do not email [info@cleves.co.uk](mailto:info@cleves.co.uk) or [office@cleves.co.uk](mailto:office@cleves.co.uk) with any absence information as these inboxes are not monitored consistently throughout the day. This will help ensure that your message is received promptly by our admin team.
