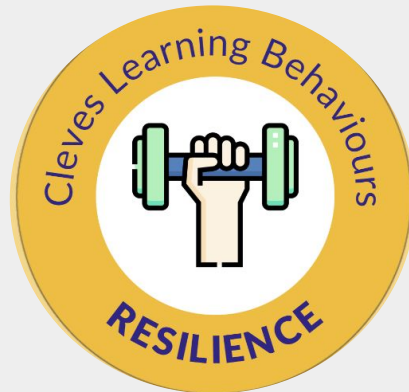
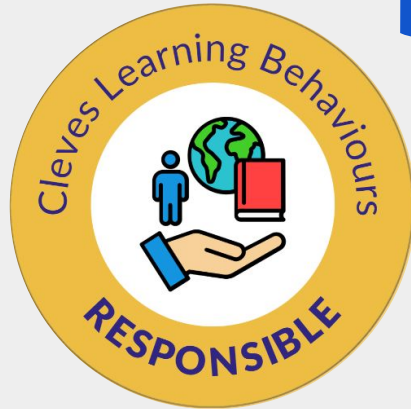

The Cleves day



- School is open from **8.30am**
- School day starts at **8.45am**
- Early Risers is available from **7.45am** - book in advance.
- Say goodbye at the gate - children can come to the classroom independently.



- Collection from classroom doors at **3.15pm**
- Children can be collected by a pre-agreed person. please inform the teacher/office in advance.
- Anyone not collected will be taken to reception to wait.

Lunch



- Your child may bring in a healthy packed lunch.
- For school lunches, there is a choice of
 - hot meal
 - vegetarian option
 - pasta/jacket potato
 - cold deli bar
- Meal choices are pre-booked and made at home
- Menus are on website
- Lunches must be pre-booked online at least **72hrs in advance** - *you have been given Link code to set up a Scopay account - please set this up before Sept.*
- **If a meal is not booked, you will be expected to provide a packed lunch.**
- Payment made online via Scopay

Break time

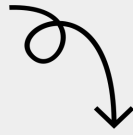


- Your child may bring in a break time snack of **fruit or vegetables**.
 - Since we are Healthy School, fruit roll ups, cereal bars or similar are not permitted



- We ask that water bottles are non-spill - ie sports spouts
 - Large bottles such as Stanley cups are not suitable.

School Uniform



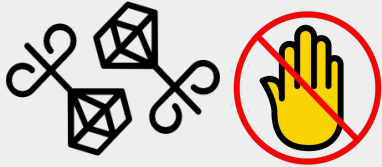
The items marked with an * can be ordered from our uniform supplier AlleyCatz.

- White shirt with collar
- Blue and gold striped tie*
- Grey skirt (not jersey)
- Trousers - plain grey (no zips, no leggings)
- Grey shorts
- Cleves jumper/cardigan
- Blue checked dress/playsuit (light/dark blue - can be worn from start of Summer term up until October half-term)
- Grey/navy/white socks (no sports socks or trainer socks)
- Navy/grey plain tights
- Suitable black shoes (no ankle boots)
- Suitable coat - any colour

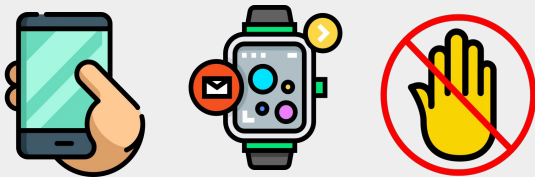
School Uniform



- Hair should be neat and tidy and tied away from the face using a **plain navy hairband** or **Cleves scrunchie**.
- If it is long enough to be tied back, it must be in a hairband - **boys and girls** !



- **No earrings are permitted** for safety reasons
- These must be removed at home prior to coming to school.



- If brought to school, mobile phones must be **switched off** and in bags throughout the school day.
- They may only be switched on when off the school site.
- Smart phones are not permitted.

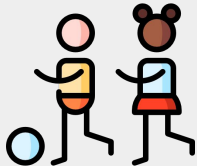

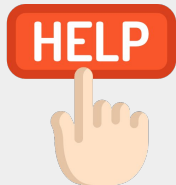

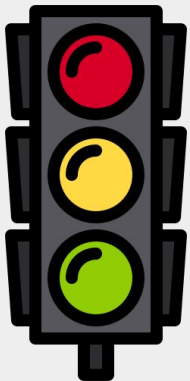

- Hurting someone

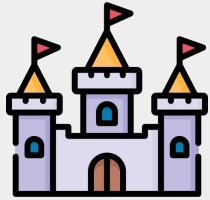
