Curriculum Overview Where can you find it?



Topics

- The British Isles
- Ancient Egypt
- Rainforests

<u>Geography</u>
The children will be learning about the about the countries that make up the UK and identify capital cities & landmarks. We will also look at where we live, our local area and the counties that surround Surrey.
Computing
Children will first learn how to log into the Hub and to handle equipment. We will then teach them about E-safety and keyboard skills, as well as coding later in the year.
<u>Science</u>
Forces and magnets and rocks will be taught in autumn, followed by all living things in spring and finally plants in the

summer.

Mrs Harrison <u>Historu</u> We look at the history of our local area in our initial geography lessons and then will be studying ancient Egypt in the spring term. Art This term, children will learn key facts about the techniques that were used to create surrealism pieces of work. We will look at creating texture & mixing colours. In the spring, children will learn about ancient Egyptian art and will create their own clay cartouche. In summer we focus on self portraits based on the works of Frida Kahlo **Music** Children will study musical structures across a range of genres, as well as spending one term learning to play the recorder and one term learning the violin.

We will be looking at Christianity (Jesus & his miracles) & how artists help us to understand what Christians believe and do. Children will be creating a Christmas stocking, then cooking falafel in the spring and finally in the summer term, they design and make a moving rainforest animal. Games & PE Indoor athletics, gymnastics and skills and coordination activities based on the 'Real PE' programme. are some of the sports covered during class games and PE lessons.



We will be exploring a range of genres and texts across the year. The children will receive 4 Literacy lessons per week, one punctuation and grammar lesson and 3 spelling sessions.


In addition, they will also have a handwriting lesson.
