The children will be learning about the features of rivers and drawing comparisons between the River Thames and the River Ganges.	We will be studying 5 different civilizations across 2 terms; the Greeks, Romans, Celts, Vikings and Anglo-Saxons.	We will be looking at Sikhism, Judaism and Christianity.
Computing Children will continue to learn about E-safety as well as coding and computer Programming.	Art Impressionism - investigating and printing onto fabric Abstract Architecture - layering and collaging images of architecture Wonderful Weaving - learning different weaving techniques	DT Creating a reusable fabric bag followed by a wooden marble maze and then study cooking in the Summer Term.

We aim to set homeworks relating to different subjects e.g. art, history, geography, writing, science.

Please encourage your children to be independent and complete the work to the best of their ability. It's helpful to check through their work with them, prior to handing it in.

Please also help to ensure that it's handed in on time - thank you for your support.

Reading Records



- Range of Texts Recommended Reading List
- Use of *Reading Record* at least 3 entries a week. Parents/guardians are required to sign once a week.
- Reading records given in on the class library day.
- Even if your children can read independently, please read with them at least twice a week.

Revision of all sounds via a system called **Sounds Write** this supports children to:



- Identify sounds accurately and know the different spelling of each sound and the different ways that some sounds can be spelt.
- Developing the fluent ability to count syllables and apply sounds.
- Spelling of common exception words to be practised via homework and in spelling sessions in class.

Handwriting - why do we focus on it?

The National Curriculum

Statutory requirements

Handwriting

Pupils should be taught to:

- sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly
- begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
- form capital letters
- form digits 0-9
- understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (i.e. letters that are formed in similar ways) and to practise these.

Legible writing that can be produced comfortably at speed and with little conscious effort allows a child to attend to the higher-level aspects of writing composition and content.

Handwriting - what are the expectations?

- We follow a scheme called PenPals.
- Year 4 will continue the practise from Year 3 in handwriting books with the reward of a pen passport.
- All year groups will have high aspirations for their children's handwriting.






Uniform:
