

Expectations

- Children are becoming more independent and taking responsibility for their learning, equipment and doing their homework.
- They know they can ask for help when they need it whether that is with school work, homework or friendships.
- We encourage children to develop resilience and to understand that occasional disappointment, feeling left out or friendship issues are all normal parts of school life.
- Children will make mistakes whether this be behaviour choices, school work or something else. We understand this is part of the process of learning and will help them grow.

Managing Behaviour and Choices

- Children are encouraged and given chances to improve their behaviour choices.
- If a reminder is given, we may discuss it with the child privately.
- If a consequence is given, children are given the opportunity to explain what happened and talk about their perspective and feelings.
- We appreciate parental support with this.




