Statutory requirements

Handwriting

Pupils should be taught to:

- sit correctly at a table, holding a pencil comfortably and correctly
- begin to form lower-case letters in the correct direction, starting and finishing in the right place
- form capital letters
- form digits 0-9
- understand which letters belong to which handwriting 'families' (i.e. letters that are formed in similar ways) and to practise these.

Legible writing that can be produced comfortably at speed and with little conscious effort allows a child to attend to the higher-level aspects of writing composition and content.



Handwriting - what are the expectations?



- We follow a scheme called PenPals.
- Year 3 will be doing frequent handwriting lessons throughout the week, covering all letters and joins.
- Year 4 will continue this practise in handwriting books with the reward of a pen passport.
- Upper school will recap areas where the children have gaps using PenPals. These sessions will be a maximum of 5 minutes up to 3x a week.
- All year groups will have high aspirations for their children's handwriting.






Reading Records (Due in on class library day)

Weekly reading expectations.

Children to read at least 4 times a week and at least once to an adult who must then sign their Reading Record.

When reading with your child, please ask them questions to check and secure their understanding of the text.

Children are expected to read a different book from either the Recommended Reading List or the World Cup of Books List every half term. RR lists are being relaunched in the next couple of weeks.

Usually, a task will be set based on this approximately two thirds of the way through each half term. Therefore, it is important children start each half term with their new book to ensure they have completed it in time to complete the task set.

Water containers like this are unsuitable for school.




